

## ORGANIZATION OF CAMP (Typical Summer)

Campers and their counselors stay in wood-paneled cabins, with a restroom and showers.	This unit was recently renovated, with accessible restrooms in the cabins and showers down the hall.	This unit was also renovated (along with Unit 2), and each has a covered/screened in porch to escape from the summer bugs.	This unit houses our campers who have not yet completed Kindergarten, in two large cabins with a playroom in the middle of the unit.	This is the most accessible unit on camp, with 3 large cabins and 2 barrier-free bathroom/shower rooms.
Campers in Unit 1 have the unique experience of being able to both learn from the example of older campers, and to be the example as they age, because of the age-span.	Campers in Unit 2 work on a wide variety of interests and skills, from exercise/strengthening, to sports skills, to chess.	Not that campers in Unit 3 mind bugs. These campers are often taking adventures into the woods, to the beach or to the frog pond.	Campers in Unit 4 remain at camp for half the summer (3.5 weeks), and are affectionately called "nookers".	Campers in Unit 5 primarily use or are working on power mobility, and they tend to be the most close-knit group on camp.
